Another beautiful day on the not-so-Terrible Two

The 24th edition of the Terrible Two double centruy was run on Saturday, June 26, 1999. 192 riders set off into the rising sun at 5:30 AM, riding in a massive peloton through the sleepy streets of Santa Rosa, headed for a very long day on the beautiful backroads of Napa and Sonoma Counties. It was a longer day for some than for others, but eventually, 163 riders completed the course, 152 of them by 10:00 PM, thereby qualifying to wear the prestigious "I Did It!" t-shirts.

The 79% finishing rate is consistent with other recent Terrible Twos, which have seen the finishing rate hovering between 75% and 80%. This is in contrast to the "traditional" finishing rate of below 60%, which prevaled on the old, 211-mile course. Shortening the course to an even 200 miles (in 1995) is the primary reason for the improvement in finishing percentage, but a secondary factor in this respect has to be the heat, or rather the lack of it: once again this year, the weather was nearly perfect for cycling. The official high on the day for Cloverdale was 89°, which translates to perhaps the low 90's on the exposed climbs of Skaggs Springs Road after lunch. As icing on the cake, there was a very friendly tailwind blowing down the coast to help the riders along, late in the day.

What's really amazing is that this marks the sixth year in a row that it has been relatively mild on TT Saturday, and then has soared to well over 100° within the following week. This year, after the 89° on Saturday, it was 100° on Sunday, 105° on Monday, 107° on Tuesday, etc. Not since 1992 and '93—when the highs were 106° and 108° respectively—have the TT troops had to endure the furnace-like heat of Skaggs on one of its really kiln-dried days. How long we can keep winning this game of meterological dodge-ball remains to be seen!

The rider who turned in the shortest day of all this year (among the finishers at least) was Oakland's Ray Plumhoff. Ray had finished second the past two years and has now finally rid himself of the bridesmaid stigma. His time of 11:27 is seven minutes off the course record and is the second fastest TT ever. We asked Ray for his comments on his day, and this is what he had to say...

"Tim Coleman, Darren Dodge, Rich Boettner and I all left the lunch stop at about the same time. Any of us could have won it. I feel very lucky to have pulled it off against those guys. When I went into the lead about five miles into the Skaggs climb(s), I had very mixed feelings. I was thrilled to be alone in the lead (for the first time ever), but I wasn't sure I could do 85 miles alone, especially if any of those three were working together. I suffered through a bout of cramps down the coast and up the Fort Ross Climb. At the top of Fort Ross, one of your support crew told me that I was half a mile ahead and that the race was "yours to lose." I got a real adrenaline rush—I admit that winning the TT has been a dream since even before the first time I did it in '96—and I decided to go all out up Black Mountain, despite how I was feeling. By the time I got over that and down to Cazadero, the cramps had disappeared and I felt much more confident. The rush continued and basically carried me to the finish."

Congratulations to Ray, to Laura Stern (whose 13:18 was the second fastest women's time ever), and to all the other riders who tackled and conquered this bad boy of a a double. Even if the weather wasn't as hot as it sometimes can be, this is still a wicked piece of work and a very tough tour of duty, and all who finish it should be very proud of their efforts.

All in all, this was one of the most uneventful Terrible Twos in recent memory. There were a handful of relatively minor crashes. True to form, at least six riders lost it in exactly the same spot on the steep descent off the backside of Trinity...not in a mass pile-up, mind you, but all as individuals, one right after the other, and all as a result of too much speed for that set of corners. (What's new?) No one was seriously hurt and only one rider had to drop out with a terminally bent bike. Another rider (Gustavo Hernandez) went over the cliff into Big Sulphur Creek Canyon in the exact same spot where John Eberly took the plunge last year. Fortu-

nately, he managed to grab a branch on the way down and kept from dropping as far as John did. he too was able to continue and finish. Ken Holloway was knocked down by a car in a slow-speed tangle in Cazadero. He was a bit banged up, and the two outer rings of this triple chain ring were bent in the fall, but he was able to make repairs, get back on the bike, and madly spin his way to a top-25 finish in his granny gear.

Two riders had to abandon after stuffering allergic reactions to bee stings. We know of at least four riders who were stung, all near Dutcher Creek, and if we heard about that many, there were probably more. Hey, if the heat won't cooperate, we have to think of something else to make the ride terrible, so we send in the killer bees!

Ray Plumhoff had one other comment about the ride which seems to pretty well sum up the event, and we'd like to close our report with his thoughts. "The really unique thing about the TT is an atmosphere of both competitiveness and camaraderie. It attracts very accomplished riders who very much want to do well, but who also want to share a difficult challenge with other riders willing to endure, and enjoy, this beautiful but inevtitably painful journey. It is that quality which will make me want to continue doing this ride long after I have decided that others are not worth the pain."
