Terrible Two 2001: another year, another record

Words such as "blistering," "torrid," and "scorching" could well have been used to describe the 2001 Terrible Two double century. However, they would be referring not to the weather but to the pace. The weather was in fact quite hot—as hot as it's been for a TT in several years—but the real heat on June 30 was being generated by the riders in the lead pack.

Leading the charge were four perennial TT stalwarts: Tracy Colwell, Ray Plumhoff, Daryn Dodge, and Rich Boettner. (Tracy won in 1998 and 2000—when he lowered the course record to 11:18—and Ray won in 1999. Dodge has been second or third in the last three TT's he's entered. And Rich? Let's call him the young gun in the group...ready to challenge the established pecking order.) These four set such a wicked pace in the early going that everyone else eventually either dropped off or hung on grimly and then blew up. They hit the lunch stop at mile 109 at 10:51, good for an average speed of 20.4 mph. Not bad for a run that includes Trinity and the Geysers!

Boettner never even slowed down at lunch, bombing right on through with just a wave to the timekeepers. The other three stopped for a minute or two to refuel before giving chase. There was some speculation in this group as to whether Rich could stay away, or whether he would crack on the brutal Skaggs Springs climbs in the afternoon heat. The short answer is that yes, he did crack. But the long answer take a little more telling. And for that, we need to look at the weather.

Just how hot was it? All the riders felt it was pretty darn toasty. Cateye cyclometers were reading well on the high side of 100° up on Skaggs in the afternoon. But the official high in Cloverdale was only 93°, and that's what we use as our annual benchmark. The following day, the official high was 100° and on Monday it hit 107°. Imagine what the cyclometer readings would have been then! So while it was plenty hot enough on TT day, it could have been a lot worse. On the plus side, many riders commented on the generally favorable winds all day, including a user-friendly tailwind running south along the coast.

At any rate, regardless of what the numbers say, it felt hot on Skaggs, and many riders suffered from it with deydration and cramps. Even the front-runners were not immune. Boettner held his lead until the infamous Rancheria Wall, where monster cramps forced him to walk almost the entire pitch, during which ordeal he was caught and passed by Dodge. However, once over the top of the hill, Boettner chased with a vengeance and caught Dodge by the Fort Ross stop. Somewhere on Fort Ross Road, the two good friends from Davis called a truce and started working together to build their lead. Although both were hurting, they stayed with it all the way to the finish and were rewarded with a new course record of 11:05. lopping a whopping 13 minutes off Colwell's mark set last year. This year, Tracy finished third, 20 minutes back. (Third place by 20 minutes...with a time that would have been first on all but two of the previous 25 TTs. These guys are really raising the bar!) Ray Plumhoff and Jim Frink finished four minutes later at 11:29. Altogether, 11 riders broke 12 hours...the most to ever do so.

There were more "mosts" this year: most registered riders (297) and most official starters (252). But not the most finishers. Last year, with 245 starters, 199 finished, 183 by ten (75%). This year, 186 finished, 168 by ten (67%). Another number that was down was crashes. After last year's carnage, we stressed safety and sanity, in our literature, in our rules, and in our pre-ride briefing. Perhaps our dire warnings paid off, or perhaps we were just lucky, but there were only three crashes of any significance, and only one that resulted in a trip to the hospital.

Laura Stern was the top women's finisher, coming in at 12:43. Laura has entered twice now—previously in 1999—and has finished first twice, and in the process has logged the second and third fastest times ever for women, trailing only Muffy Ritz'1995 record of 12:25. Liz Gomez. last year's top female finisher, was not

entered this year, but was working at one of the rest stops instead. However, she may feel she won just as big a prize this time around. She was at the finish when Rich and Daryn arrived, and the first thing Rich did, after all the cheering had died down, was to pull an engagement ring out of his jersey pocket, drop to one knee, and present it to Liz. "I carried this for 200 miles, Liz...will you marry me?" What could she say? (She said yes.) Perhaps next year, these two top finishers should try it on a bicycle built for two.

The True-Grit-No-Brains Award for 2001 goes to another former winner and course record holder, Ken Eichstaedt. (It was Ken's record of 11:20 that Colwell beat last year.) Ken finished in a time of 15:43...mid-pack. Not too noteworthy, you say? What if we told you he did it on a fixed-gear? Ken had a 42-tooth chainring and had rigged a rear wheel with a gear on each side: a 20 for the climbs and a 16 for everything else. At the base of each of the major climbs, he would stop and flop the wheel, setting up an easygoing 42-20 climbing combo. Ouch! Ken was unrepentently cheerful at the finish, insisting he had actually had a good time all day.

Ken's approach to the event might strike most of us as a bit beyond the fringe, but then anyone doing this ride on anything less than a motorcycle is considered beyond the fringe by the general public. The whole proposition is a bit daft, isn't it? Hats off, hugs, and hoorahs to all who entered and conquered this toughest of all tough doubles.
