Mild weather leads to wild times on Terrible Two

Pleasant riding weather contributed to a record-breaking Terrible Two double century on June 22, 2002. Records were set for fastest men's and women's finishes. And while the total number of finishers was not a record—194, as compared to 199 in 2000—the percentage of finishers—85%—was…an indication of the relatively benign conditions.

None of the 231 cyclists who rode off into the fog-shrouded sunrise saw even a glimmer of sunshine until somewhere around Alexander Valley—perhaps mile 70—and that set the tone on a day when the hottest readings were only in the mid-80's, and where tailwinds outnumbered headwinds, especially later in the day.

But let's not give the weather too much of the credit for the superb performances of the riders. We're seeing a steady improvement in overall fitness and preparation for this challenging event, and it's paying off in good results. Coupled with mild weather and good support, most folks are riding very well and a few are simply scorching the rugged landscape of Napa and Sonoma Counties. First in this year were Santa Rosa's Brian Anderson, 31, and Mark Riedy, 34, Fairfax, finishing together in a time of 10:50, breaking the mythic 11-hour barrier and shattering the record of 11:05 set last year. The course record has now been broken three years in a row, dropping 30 minutes over that span.

Not too far behind, in fifth place overall, Catharina Berge, 35, Visalia, was the first woman in at 11:35, taking a huge, 50-minute bite out of Muffy Ritz' 1995 record of 12:25. Last year's top woman, Laura Stern, 40, Menlo Park, was second this year in a time of 12:16. She may perhaps take some consolation from knowing her second-place time this year represents an almost half-hour improvement over her winning time last year. Although Berge has only been cycling seriously for two years—and this was her first TT—her performance was not entirely unexpected, as she had astonished the ultra world by finishing second overall at last year's Furnace Creek 508.

The two leading men did surprise many people though. Neither is a regular on the California Triple Crown double century circuit. Other strong riders who had done well in the previous two legs of the CTC Stage Race—Devil Mountain and Central Coast—were a bit startled to find these two unheralded riders keeping up until Camp Gualala and then dropping everyone else on the dreaded Rancheria Wall. They rode through the Tin Barn junction with less than a minute's lead on Rupert Brauch—last year's Stage Race winner—but he essentially was never in contact again, as the two began working together in true breakaway fashion and poured on the coal all the way to the end.

While Reidy—a mountain bike racer—was doing the TT for the first time, Anderson is no stranger to the event, having done it five years in a row, with a previous best of 12:05. (An improvement of 1:15 in one's time was not unusual on this generally fast day: SRCC's Bill Ellis, for example, who finished tied for fifth with Berge, took 2:08 off his PR.) It's common to find the results of the TT littered with the names of riders generally unknown to the regulars on the doubles trail. The Terrible Two's reputation is such that it often attracts a large handful of independent riders who simply like the TT because it's so challenging, so scenic, and just so darn cool—road racers, mountain bikers, and plain old homeboy hammerheads—riders who've never heard of Furnace Creek or the California Triple Crown, and who couldn't care less about RAAM.

Back through the field, better-than-average results mirrored those of the front runners, with personal best times the order of the day for many happy finishers. For the most part, our sag fleet was not hard pressed to keep up with the calls upon its services. Among the few who did sag out were several who had mechanicals that kept them from otherwise good finishes, and a few who had the bad luck of starting the ride with a touch of the flu...never a good career move. Even on its most kind-hearted day, this is still a brutally tough course, and if you have any weaknesses at all, the ride will find them. Crashes this year were at an all-time low, with only one causing enough damage to warrant a trip to the emergency room: a broken wrist picked up—you guessed it—in the county line hairpins on the backside of Trinity.

Probably the biggest winners on the day will be our t-shirt silk-screeners. What with almost 200 "I DID IT!" shirts for the finishers and over 100 regular shirts for the workers, it will be the biggest run of TT shirts ever. 100 workers? Can that be right? You bet! That's a ratio of almost one support person for every two riders, and that's one of the reasons this ride is so well thought of by its participants: good support and lots of it.
